

Level 3 Clinical Healthcare Support (Wales)

This qualification is for senior health care assistants primarily working within clinical hospital settings in Wales, providing delegated nursing support to individuals accessing Welsh health services under the direction of a registered practitioner. It provides the core qualification that recognises roles currently undertaken by senior health care assistants working within these settings. It also provides the basis for continuing professional development for health care assistants.

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Essential Skills

Welsh Government is committed to raising the levels of Essential Skills across Wales. Communication, Digital Literacy and Application of Number qualifications are an integral element of the funded apprenticeship frameworks.

These are usually delivered through workshops at one of our centres and will be planned well in advance. If you have completed Essential Skills previously or are able to provide suitable evidence, such as GCSE certificates or similar, you may be exempt from completing this element of the qualification.

Qualification Overview

To achieve this qualification the learners need to achieve a **minimum of 60 credits**. The qualification is split in to three categories:

- 16 credits from Mandatory Group A
- 16 credits from Mandatory Group B1 or 19 credits from Mandatory Group B2
- A minimum of 28 credits from Optional Group C
- The qualification will take 15 months to complete

The qualification is made up of occupational knowledge and competence covered by a range of assessment methods.
